GLADWIN COUNTY ELECTION

Do Hereby Determine:

That the following Propositions or questions were passed or defeated as indicated below:

Emergency medical services

Shall the previously voted one (1) mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000. Taxable Assessed Valuation) increase in the 15 mill tax limitation on general ad valorem taxes provided in Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution, upon taxable real and tangible personal property within Gladwin County, be renewed for levy of up to 1 mill in the years 2001-2004, inclusive, for the provision of emergency medical services for Gladwin County, Michigan, which levy will raise in the first year of the levy an estimated sum of \$622,245.00?

Roll-Back Restoration

Shall the maximum tax levy for the County of Gladwin general operating purposes, which was established by allocation to be 5.75 mills (1 mill being \$1.00 per \$1,000 of taxable valuation of property as finally equalized) and is presently anticipated to be levied at 4.9265 mills for 2001, by reason of Article IX, Section 31 of the Michigan Constitution and Section 34d of the General Property Tax Act, be restored to 5.75 mills, being an increase of .8235 mills, for the December 2001 tax billings and henceforth subject to provisions of law?

It is estimated that adoption of this proposition will raise an additional amount of \$512,500 in the December 2001 tax billing, with an assessed valuation of \$622,256.00.

911 Operations

Shall the County of Gladwin assess eight (8%) percent of the highest monthly rate charged by a service supplier for basic local exchange service in Gladwin County pursuant to statute, for the purpose of providing operational funds for Gladwin County emergency telephone operations (commonly known as 911 service), with such assessment not to exceed \$1.60 per month; said assessment to be for a five (5) year period commencing no earlier than November 1, 2001, pursuant to MCL 484.1401(8), and to be paid through monthly telephone company billings?

This assessment will be in addition to the present four(4%) percent assessment approved by the Gladwin County Board of commissioners, and is anticipated to raise \$175,000 each year.

**Billings Township
FIRE DEPARTMENT EQUIPMENT**

Shall the Township of Billings levy up to ½ mill (1 mill is \$1.00 per \$1,000 of assessed taxable value, as finally equalized for purposes of purchase and maintenance of fire department equipment, for five (5) years (being the December 2001 – December 2006 tax billing), said amount being in excess of the 15 mill limitation provided in Article IX of the Michigan Constitution of 1963.

This is a renewal of a millage which expired in December 2000, and which was levied at 0.4643 mills. If this proposition is approved, it is estimated that \$34,136.00 will be raised the first year.
