## Commissioner Minutes of November 14, 2017

The Gladwin County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session on Tuesday, November 14, 2017. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Chairman Walters. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a short prayer was given. Roll call found all Commissioners present.

There were no changes or additions to the agenda. Motion by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Hinman, to proceed with the consent agenda as prepared. Ayes carried, motion passed.

The **cash balances** were then read by Commissioner Aultman. *General Fund* - \$1,032,664.13 with all prior advances paid in full.

The minutes of October 24, 2017 were then reviewed. *Motion by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Hinman, to approve the minutes as prepared.* Ayes carried, **motion passed**.

#### Public Comments:

Yvette Keast, Director, Gladwin County Chamber of Commerce, commented that the Legislative Breakfast series will be starting in January and would invite the Commissioners to participate. All sessions will begin at 7:30 and the County speakers will be asked to attend the January session.

Stacey DeMoines, Beaverton City resident, asked when the Animal Control department would be reinstated to full time with the passing of the millage at the first of the year. Chairman Walters commented that full time status would begin the first of the year and that they are reviewing options on establishing a board or committee for the millage funding.

#### <u>Finance Matters – Commissioner Aultman:</u>

- 1. The Board has budgeted \$30,000 for a payment to MERS per their plan for underfunding. Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Birgel, to allow the Clerk to make the additional distribution to MERS. Ayes carried, motion passed.
- 2. Chris Richards, Probate Court employee, has retired from the office effective 10-20-2017 and has requested payout of 101 hours in the amount of \$1,634.18 from line item 101-148-706.003. Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Birgel, to allow the Clerk to compensate Ms. Richards for the time requested. Discussion on the replacement of this employee. Ayes carried, motion passed.
- 3. The Prosecutor has requested permission to use the credit card for the online ordering of carbonless forms in the amount of \$199.44, plus shipping. Once approved this expense can be taken from line item 101-229-727.000. Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Birgel, to allow the Clerk to use the credit card for the purchase as outlined. Ayes carried, motion passed.
- 4. Hannah McGuire, Probate Court, has enrolled to take her CEP exam in March of 2018. A course fee of \$60.00 is due at this time and will need to be made using the County's credit card. Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Birgel, to allow the Clerk permission to complete the transaction as outlined. Ayes carried, motion passed.

- 5. The Undersheriff has requested permission to hire a resigned employee back into a full time corrections position that is vacant. Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Birgel, to accept the union's agreement to offer the position at the 100% wage step and with his enrollment in division 20 of MERS. Ayes carried, motion passed.
- 6. The committee has reviewed the appropriation to Mental Health and would ask the Board for discussion and input of the matter for the possible reduction of the annual appropriation for 2018. Commissioner Aultman commented that she has done a lot of research on the matter and she was not able to find an agreement with the terms of the appropriation. Discussion. Motion by Commissioner Birgel, supported by Commissioner Smith to table the matter for further research. Ayes carried, motion passed.
- 7. The committee has started the process to begin searching for new civil counsel. Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Hinman, to allow the committee to review bids for the position and bring those bids back to the Board for approval. Ayes carried, motion passed.
- 8. After review and discussion, the finance committee would like the permission of the Board to allow the Clerk and Treasurer to complete the CIP requirement to the State of Michigan. The Clerk and Treasurer will split the 1.5% payment under the grants policy if approved. Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Smith to allow the Clerk and Treasurer to handle the filing with compensation as outlined. Ayes carried, motion passed. Commissioner Birgel voting no.
- 9. Rick Ghent, Maintenance Supervisor, has requested to purchase a used carpet cleaner in the amount of \$600.00 from line item 101-265-727.000. Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Birgel, to allow for the purchase as requested. Ayes carried, motion passed.
- 10. Three Sheriff Department vehicles have been damaged in a car/deer accident and reported to MMRMA for insurance claims. After discussion, motion was made by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Birgel, to allow the insurance adjuster to review the three bids that were submitted for these claims and follow their recommendation for the repairs. The "push bumpers" would need to be purchased by the County and reimbursed through MMRMA, since the repair facilities don't have access to the purchase of these devices. Ayes carried, motion passed.

Kim Halis, Equalization Director, came before the Board to have the 2018 millage rates approved for levy and for review and approval of the apportionment report that was tabled from last meeting. Discussion on the drain assessments. Treasurer VanTiem commented that the Drain Commissioner has not provided her with the assessment rolls to be placed on the winter tax billings. Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Birgel, to allow the Treasurer to levy the 2016 assessments for lake level, lake improvements and drains to be placed on the 2017 winter tax billing. Ayes carried, motion passed. The Board then reviewed the resolution provided by the Equalization Director for the levy of the 2018 millage rates. Motion by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Hinman, to adopt the resolution presented. Roll call vote as follows: Hinman – yes, Walters – yes, Aultman –yes, Smith –yes, Birgel –yes. Commissioners Aultman and Birgel noting reservations in their decision to vote yes. Ayes carried, resolution 2017-025 declared adopted.

#### Commissioner Hinman reported:

- That the grant packet for the Indigent Defense Counsel has been prepared and is ready for submission to the State, but will require the approval from the Board and a signature from the Chairman. Commissioner Hinman reviewed the document, noting that this is a "working application" and will probably receive several revisions before accepted. Discussion. Motion by Commissioner Hinman, supported by Commissioner Birgel, to accept the grant as prepared and allow the Chairman to sign as presented. Ayes carried, motion passed.
- On attending the Butman Township meeting.
- That he attended the Clement Township meeting.
- Next week are the Sherman and Gladwin Township meetings.
- That he and Commissioner Birgel will be meeting in negotiations with the Corrections Unit today.
- On the DATA meeting held on the November 1st.
- That he attended the EOC tabletop training.
- On many visits to Clare County to work on the Indigent Defense Counsel grant with the State of Michigan. Commissioner Hinman noted that this grant is only good through the point that the State has funding.

#### Commissioner Smith reported:

- That she attended the Council of Local Government meeting on October 30<sup>th</sup>, noting great food and conversation.
- On the EOC training that she attended on October 31<sup>st</sup>, commenting that they will be held on the last Tuesday of each month.
- On the DATA meeting where they discussed drafting an RFP for IT services for use after January 1, 2018.
- That she attended the Hay Township meeting, noting all is well there.
- That the Library Board held a special meeting on November 9<sup>th</sup> and accepted an offer to purchase the American Legion Building in the Wooden Shoe area.
- On attending the Veterans Day program on November 11<sup>th</sup>, commenting that it was very well done.
- On the Tobacco Township meeting last night where the mosquito millage and marijuana law changes were addressed.
- The site in days end today at the Tobacco River Muzzleloading Club.
- That she would like to congratulate the Beaverton Football and Volleyball programs on their seasons, commenting that the Volleyball program set many records throughout their season.

#### Commissioner Birgel reported:

- On the Beaverton City DDA and regular session meeting that he attended. Beaverton City is still working on reorganizing their finances and is working on the placement of a new City Manager. The City has been receiving the assistance of Scott Govitz, who ran the DDA meeting for them.
- Beaverton Township has been working on the necessary language changes to their zoning plan for medical marijuana law, commenting that their business must comply with the existing zoning laws.
- That union negotiations are underway. Commissioner Birgel commented that the original plan was to provide for a 1% raise, but with the premium renewal on the healthcare has provided difficulties. Commissioner Birgel spoke on different options that are being looked at to potentially resolve the issues.

• On the resignation of Melissa Alex, Veterans Director, effective November 24<sup>th</sup>. The job posting has been published and they will be reviewing candidates for the position.

#### Commissioner Aultman reported:

- On attending the CMDHD annual meeting, followed by their awards ceremony.
- That she met with Jackie Morgan from USDA on a loan to accommodate the many repairs needed in the county buildings. With the application, come various options including the hiring of a general contractor, or the use of an architect. With these renovations may come upgrades to Consumers Energy projects that will be cost savings to the County. Discussion. Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Hinman, to move forward with the loan application through USDA with the use of an architect to complete the project. Further discussion. Ayes carried, motion passed.
- On the Michigan Works meeting on October 27<sup>th</sup> where they reviewed the 2018 grants that were received. Commissioner Aultman has information for the Board to review if they wish.
- That she also attended the Council of Local Government Harvest Dinner on October 30<sup>th</sup>, commenting on the interesting conversation.
- On the EOC exercise on November 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- That she attended the EmCOG meeting on November 3<sup>rd</sup> in Roscommon where they discussed statewide projects and the Lake State Railway.
- On the Mental Health meeting on October 31<sup>st</sup>, noting they reviewed their financial audit and other materials she has available for the Board's review.
- That the EDC meeting was held on November 8<sup>th</sup>, highlighting several new jobs coming to the area. Commissioner Aultman has the EDC newsletter available for review.
- That she attended the Airport meeting, commenting the hanger project should be complete in the next three weeks and the "Santa Fly In" will be December 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- On the Finance meeting on November 9<sup>th</sup>.
- On budget meetings held on November 13<sup>th</sup>.
- That she attended the Bentley Township meeting where they had questions on DDAs collecting money off of special millage proposals. Discussion on the "Tax Capture Law".
- On the Billings Township meeting, commenting that their road millage passed and they are still waiting on approval for their senior meal site.

#### Comments from the Chairman:

- That he too attended the Council of Local Government meeting on October 30th.
- On the EDC meeting, noting it went well.
- That the Veterans Day ceremony went great, even with the cold weather there was a great turnout. Chairman Walters noted that with the resignation of the Director, they would be looking at applicants to fill the vacancy.
- On his work with Commissioner Aultman on the budget.
- That he met with Commissioner Aultman and a representative from Consumers on energy savings projects.
- That Gladwin City residents elected Dee Jungman as their Mayor.
- That he was not able to attend the Sage Township meeting, but will be moving forward in reviewing the bids for their siren project.

- The bids for the Sage siren project, MDTs and Civil Counsel applicants will be reviewed at the next meeting.
- That he will not be present at the next Board meeting, but would like to extend a "good luck" to all the hunters and hopes that everyone stays safe.

Chairman Walters then asked the Clerk to read the press release issued in honoring the victims of the Sutherland Springs, Texas shooting. The Board then held a moment of silence for the victims and their families.

#### Public Comments -

Commissioner Smith stated the Beaverton Area Business Association will be holding their "Holiday Hunt" this weekend, November 17-18<sup>th</sup>, encouraging all to get out and support the local businesses.

Motion by Commissioner Aultman, supported by Commissioner Hinman, to receive and file various correspondence and reports. Ayes carried, motion passed.

Motion by Commissioner Hinman, supported by Commissioner Smith, to adjourn. Ayes carried, motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 10:00 a.m., until the next regular Board meeting on November 28, 2017 at 9:00 a.m., unless otherwise ordered.
