RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF BACK REVENUE SHARING

Gladwin County Board of Commissioners

RESOLUTION #2021-

SUPPORTING PASSAGE OF LEGISLATION TO PROVIDE BACK REVENUE SHARING TO COUNTIES

WHEREAS, Gladwin County has a population of 25,337 (2018) and is projected to receive \$545,848.00 or \$21.54 per person in Revenue Sharing dollars in 2021.

WHEREAS, Gladwin County is very thankful for the Revenue Sharing dollars it has received. Traditionally, State Revenue Sharing was among the County's large revenue sources.

WHEREAS, Gladwin County received \$608,881.00 in Revenue Sharing dollars in year, 2001, which was greater than the amount project for 2021.

WHEREAS, counties agreed to a tax shift in 2004 that resulted in excess revenue in property taxes. These funds were restricted into a County Revenue Sharing Reserve Fund (CRSRF).

WHEREAS, counties went off a statutory revenue sharing in 2004 to save the State money during a budget crisis and agreed to pay themselves the annual Revenue Sharing payments out of the CRSRF until those funds were exhausted.

WHEREAS, this self-payment system saved the State more than \$1.5 billion to date, and Gladwin County alone save the State \$698,347.00.

WHEREAS, each county exhausted their reserve fund at different times. (See Table A)

WHEREAS, the agreement to pay themselves their own Revenue Sharing included a provision that when they exhausted their CRSRF, they could come back on the State system at the rate they were paying themselves.

WHEREAS, the State continued to cut Revenue Sharing between 2009 and 2014, resulting in a breach of this agreement and a reduction in Revenue Sharing for those counties that came back on the system between 2008 and 2014.

WHEREAS, the counties that exhausted their CRSRF earlier than others were, and continue to be, negatively affected by the reduction in eligible payments.

WHEREAS, counties have individually and collectively "lost" by the State discontinuing CPI increases once the State resumed responsibility for CRS payments.

WHEREAS, the State has demonstrated a consistent divestment from local municipal finance through the years and over multiple administrations from both major political parties. The County of Gladwin would respectfully request the utmost consideration during the State's budget process and request the statutory component of the Revenue Sharing model be adjusted.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that GLADWIN COUNTY supports legislation to ensure proper Revenue Sharing adjustments are made to cover the shortfalls that continue to adversely impact Gladwin residents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Governor of the State of Michigan, Senator John Moolenaar, Representative Jason Wentworth, and all affected Michigan Counties for their consideration and action.

RESOLUTION NAMING DELEGATED AUTHORITY AND AUTHORIZING ANNUAL EXPENDITURES OVER \$10,000

The following resolution was offered by Commissioner and supported by Commissioner
WHEREAS, Part 307 of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, MCL 324.30701, et seq. ("Part 307") outlines a process to maintain established legal lake levels and to repair, maintain, or create improvements necessary to maintain such levels; and
WHEREAS, if there is a necessity for annual expenditures of over \$10,000 to fund activities to maintain a lake level, a board of county commissioners must authorize the expenditures by resolution. MCL 324.30722(4); and
WHEREAS, Part 307 authorizes a county board of commissioners to designate a "delegated authority" to maintain a legal lake level. MCL 324.30701(e); and
WHEREAS, the Gladwin County Circuit Court has continuing jurisdiction under MCL 324.30707(5) to modify Pratt Lake's lake level order including its legal lake level; and
WHEREAS, Pratt Lake is an inland lake located in Sage Township, Gladwin County, Michigan; and
WHEREAS, an inspection of Pratt Lake's lake level improvements disclosed the necessity for an annual expenditure of over \$10,000 to maintain its legal lake level.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

Pursuant to Section 30722(4) of Part 307, the Gladwin County Board of Commissioners authorizes the Pratt Lake Authority to make annual expenditures of more than \$10,000 to perform repairs and maintenance on Pratt Lake's lake level improvements by imposing such costs on the applicable special assessment district. Costs for such repairs and maintenance shall be borne by property owners and other entities via special assessments to the extent authorized by Part 307.

I am hereby requesting the board to approve the extension of our current Deputy Drain Commissioner Lucy Zeestraten to continue to work Mondays through September 30, 2021. We have a lot of projects that we are working on. I feel it requires her to be in the office to help get all the processes done. We have just been approved to change the plans for the Burleson and Davidson Creek drains with EGLE. We will be working closely with our attorney Stacy Hissong and engineers at ECT to get the plans changed. We are still working with ECT on the grant we were just awarded through NRCS. We are working with Midland County on 2 intercounty drains with them and an intercounty drain with Bay County. We currently have a POA meeting scheduled with Midland County on the Curtice IC Drain at Beaverton High School. We are working with Stacy Hissong and Spicer Group on Pratt Lake to get another structure in place after the Wier was removed by the previous drain commissioner. This will include public information meeting if need, bid opening, draft assessment roll, public hearing on project cost, roll approval by board of commissioners, project financing, assessment roll on this year's winters tax bill. We are also working with Wixom Lake to get an agreement to give funds to FLTF to help with weeds. We are also working with Stacy Hissong and Spicer Group to update the drainage district on the drains, lake levels, and assessment rolls.
